Olivia Kim McManus, MD, is a board-certified child neurologist specializing in the care of infants, children, and adolescents with neurological disorders, particularly epilepsy and medically refractory epilepsy. She has extensive expertise in clinical trials, clinical neurophysiology and epilepsy surgery, including invasive intracranial EEG monitoring and intraoperative electrocorticography. Dr. Kim McManus serves as an Associate Professor in the Department of Neurosciences and ACGME pediatric epilepsy fellowship director. She primarily cares for patients at Rady Children's Hospital San Diego and directs the Rady Precision Therapeutics Neuro-Interventional Program. Her research focuses on the development and delivery of novel genetic therapies for rare epilepsies and neurodegenerative disorders, intracranial EEG monitoring, and epilepsy surgery. Dr. Kim McManus completed her undergraduate degree in Neurosciences at Columbia University, medical degree at The George Washington University School of Medicine, residencies in pediatrics and neurology at Children's Hospital Los Angeles, and fellowships in epilepsy and clinical neurophysiology at UC Irvine. She is triple board-certified in neurology with special qualification in child neurology, epilepsy, and clinical neurophysiology.
